The purpose of this Change Order is to authorize an increase in the contract amount for the Poley Skate Park project due to documented cost escalations and necessary scope modifications identified after the original bid and award.

Updated contractor pricing increased from \$246,000 (March 2025 estimate) to \$306,700 (February 2026 estimate), representing a \$60,700 increase. This increase is primarily attributable to rising labor and material costs, as well as required adjustments to site work and drainage design.

The purpose of this policy is to establish a clear, consistent, transparent, and data-driven
