 - A. Resolution No. 22-23: The Approval of Norristown Traffic Calming Policy --- Speed Hump Device**
The purpose of this policy is to establish the Traffic Calming Guidelines in the Municipality of Norristown. Traffic calming devices can include, but are not limited to: Speed Humps, Traffic Islands, Traffic Circles, Speed Tables, Chicanes, Neck Downs, and Bulb Outs, etc.

After researching these different types of traffic calming devices, the preferred traffic calming device for the Municipality of Norristown is the speed hump. The rubber-type speed humps that are bolted down on the street pavement and are easily removable will be primarily used under this policy. It costs an average of about **\$2,000 to \$2,500**, depending on the width of the street, to install a speed hump.

A. Resolution No. 22-21: Approval to authorize a contract for \$169,950.00 with Miller Sports Construction to resurface Simmons Park Basketball Court, using CIP Funds

To resurface and replace the existing basketball court at Simmons Park. The current court has damage from heavy use and weather conditions. This will make a safer play environment for our residents.

B. Resolution No. 22-20: Approval to submit an application to the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources for the Community, Recreation and Conservation Planning Grant in the amount of \$25,000.

To research and compile the best evidence and resources on Elmwood Park and the surrounding areas along Harding Blvd. This will help in flood mitigation plans and establishing what facilities would withstand the change in climate and newly rising waters.
